CALL FOR PAPERS Church of England Foundation for Educational Leadership Inaugural Research Conference: *Vision into Practice*

Regent's Park College, University of Oxford, 8 July 2020

The Church of England Foundation for Educational Leadership was founded in 2017, with the mission: '*To develop inspirational leaders who are called, connected and committed to deliver the Church of England vision for education*'. The Foundation's Programmes, Networks and Research are already now working with leaders in over 1000 schools in England, with an emerging international network of leaders in USA, Canada and Australia.

The Foundation's work is centred on the Church of England Vision for Education, *Deeply Christian, Serving the Common Good*, published in 2016, and the practical ways that this vision can be brought alive through leadership at levels in education. - Action research and Christian Leadership
- The Bible and schools.

The conference team is keen to engage at a large range of academic levels, including those leading in university departments, postgraduate research students, and teachers and leaders in schools, colleges and Dioceses.
