


Flourishing Trusts Network Residential Agenda


What will we be doing?

- **Professor Paul Miller** Professor of Educational Leadership & Social Justice on reshaping education as a career where all can flourish, and the pursuit of EDIJ at every level in our organisations.
- Nigel Genders, Chief Executive, the National Society for Education.
- DFE ministerial engagement (name TBC) on Labour's vision, plans and priorities for the sector going forward.
